

ALMOST A C-2 JACK-WHICH ONE IS CORRECT?

While judging tools at the Joint National Meet in Tacoma, I, once again, came across many incorrect C-2 jacks in our tool kits. I have also seen several incorrect jacks for sale by unknowing dealers. These jacks have been at national meets, Hershey, and many local swaps.

The C-2 jack was used as an option on all Model "A's" from August 1930 to the end of production. It is, in my opinion, one of the harder to find jacks, even harder than the elusive C-3. This is probably why many people have been fooled by a more common jack that resembles the pictures in our *Judging Standards*.

The "almost a C-2" has several unmistakable differences from the real C-2. One difference is an internal screw within the screw which would enable it to raise the automobile to a greater height. The height of the jack fully extended is approximately 20 inches. The C-2 fully extended is only 15 inches. This is seen easily in figure 1. Figure 2 shows how much wider the double screw requires exiting the jack. This jack is also a heavier version which indicates it was used on a bigger car or perhaps a commercial vehicle.

The real C-2 as pictured in figure 3, is 8.5 inches tall and has no visible markings. This jack does not seem to be very common in the Midwest and may be more easily found in the area of the West Coast. This jack, along with the B-2, C-1, and C-3, used the folding handle A-17081-B (figure 4).

I hope this article eliminates some of the problems with restorers using the wrong jack in their tool kits, with dealers unknowingly selling the wrong jack to their customers, and with members "finding a great deal" at a local flea market.


