

Donn Mannherz will be doing a tech talk in March.





n October of 1930, Annie L. Bayless purchased a new 1930 Model A Ford DeLuxe Coupe from H. M. Lawrence Ford of Oakland, California. After owning and driving the car for 28 years, Bayless sold her Ford to Wally Shelby for \$50. It was, writes current owner Chris Shelby, "money well spent for an original-owner, garage-kept Ford with 47,785 miles on the clock." The car was affectionately named "Annie," in honor of the first owner. Shelby added, "My love for this car has never ceased, and I enjoy taking Dad, who is not driving at the age of 88, out for a few laps." Currently, the coupe has 57,241 miles on the odometer and is undergoing a complete brake job, since the original factory-installed linings are finally spent.

When Annie Bayless sold the car to Wally, it still had the Firestone tires that were on the coupe when she purchased it. Three years later, when the Ford turned 50,000 miles with the Firestones still on the job, Shelby and the car made the local papers when the tires were finally replaced. A photo at Howard Eddy Motors in Concord, California, shows Shelby and one of the technicians checking out the somewhat worn but still original "road skins."

Shelby still has Annie's original radiator-mounted brass dealer medallion, the auto club tag, and the California registration, which says Annie was sold and first registered on October 11, 1930. The tag also includes information like the engine number, A3791748, the type of car, recorded as "Coupe DeL," the name and address of the owner, and the \$3 fee.

Of interest to Model A Ford enthusiasts, and a point of curiosity for others, are some of the facts which Wally and Chris Shelby would like to share about their coupe.

First, the car was built as a 1930 DeLuxe Coupe trunk model painted Standard Black with brown mohair and wood grain moldings — but without cowl lamps. The original wire harness was set-up to allow for the lights, but they were not installed. In 1977-'78, when the car was restored, the cowl lights were added and the car was repainted Washington Blue and Tacoma Cream. "When we re-restore * the car," writes Shelby, "I will return it to black with dark green wheels and stripe — I always liked that dark, original look."

The original stripe on the side of the car was a very dark green, and it matched the car's optional painted rims. The interior tank striping was a creamy off-white, and there is an unusual script of an almost elliptical design painted on the interior firewall indent. It had to have been done by the striper because this was an original, unrestored car. "My thoughts on the striping," writes Chris Shelby, "are that the striper finished lunch early and was bored so he took his wet brush in hand and went at it." Another possibility, according to Shelby, is that the coupe was a cancelled fleet order car, evident by the lack of cowl lamps, optional dark exterior striping and rims, especially paired with the fact that the car was sold so late in the vear.

Shelby also pointed out that bedy number SF A11538 is stamped on the passenger side floorboard area, indication the car was built at the San Francisco assembly plant. According to Ford


production by body type records, a total of 29,779 DeLuxe Coupes were assembled worldwide in 1930. Of these, 1,737 were assembled at the San Francisco plant.

The DeLuxe Coupe was one of five new types announced by Ford during 1930. The others were the DeLuxe Sedan, DeLuxe Phaeton, DeLuxe

Roadster, and the Victoria. Dealers were told that the DeLuxe Coupe and Sedan were "provided to meet the constantly growing demand, particularly from women buyers, for smart, richly trimmed body interiors."

According to a June 13, 1930, Buffalo Branch price list, the DeLuxe Coupe listed at \$545 (later reduced to \$525). With his 17 1/2-percent discount, the dealer's actual cost was \$449.63. Added to this were bumpers (\$12.38), freight (\$36.25), and \$3.02 for gas and oil. Net cost to a dealer from the Buffalo Branch was \$501.28. There would be a difference for a San Francisco area dealer in the freight charge and, possibly, the cost of gas and oil. Everything else was the same.

After 44 years of ownership, Annie has become a member of the Shelby family, and the Shelby family has become a part of the car's own unique history.
